Synopses

Episode 1

The Case of the Crazy Deliveries

Educational Objective

Show children that every job involves responsibilities and a sense of organization, even if the job seems fairly simple.

Synopsis

When Zeek takes over as mailman, it's non-stop confusion in the once quiet and orderly Smiling Trees Park. What happened to Peacock's mirror? Where on earth is Dr. Green's radio? And where is Raccoon's letter? As Fishtronaut and his crew work to sort the mess out, they learn the importance of a job well done.

Episode 02

The Case of the New Best Friend

Educational Objective

To help children understand how to deal with feelings of envy and jealousy.

Synopsis

Marina and Fishtronaut have become really good friends with Napi, the long-nosed Monkey. Zeek even begins to think that Fishtronaut and Marina prefer Napi to him so he decides to hang back and sulk while the other three take off to solve another case. The POP brings Marina and Fishtronaut clues, and they show Zeek how much he really means to them.

Episode 03

The Case of the Silent Animal

Educational Objective

To demonstrate that animals and people who are incapable of speaking can still communicate in other ways.

Synopsis

A giraffe takes everyone in the park by surprise when he starts singing, instead of staying silent like all the other giraffes. Meanwhile, our heroes, following the clues left by the POP, head off in search of a deaf animal to help. But they end up discovering that the mission is actually to help a mute animal, that very same singing giraffe, who had been fooling everyone with a cicada hidden on his neck.

Episode 05 A Case of Difference

Educational Objective

Learning to deal with your fears while addressing the issue of bullying.

Synopsis

Zeek is having some problems with some of the bigger monkeys on Monkey Island. These bigger monkeys have been stealing his bananas, teasing him, and are always playing practical jokes on him. Marina and Fishtronaut notice that he's behaving a little strangely: hiding and always seeming a bit nervous. That's when a POP arrives with some clues. Fishtronaut and Marina discover what's happening and help Zeek overcome these problems.

Episode 07 The Case of SuperZeek

Educational Objective

Show children the value of collaboration and union as opposed to competition. Help children to understand that everyone has their weaknesses and that it's important to learn from them.

Synopsis

Zeek has gotten a big head. After playing an awesome game of basketball, he becomes competitive and full of himself, thinking he's better than everyone else at everything. But when he plays basketball with a team, his individualistic behavior brings down the whole team.

Episode 09 The Case of High Velocity

Educational Objective

Present the balance of nature and it's fragility when it comes to interferences.

Synopsis

Mac and Billy decide to make Smiling Trees Park more extreme in order to get ready for the big bike races. To get the track ready, they make some small changes here and there. They never dreamed these small changes would cause so many problems, some Park dwellers can't even find their way home!

Episode 11

The Case of the Lying Fish

Educational Objective

Show children the consequences of lying all the time and the importance of being honest.

Synopsis

What might happen when a bunch of crazy stories that don't even make sense begin to make their way through the Park? Reports of octopuses with five hundred tentacles, piranhas bigger than whales, and giant frogs are leaving our friends at the bottom of the lake scared silly. Could it be true or is it all a hoax? And what can be done when one of these false alarms puts a whole herd of sheep in danger? That's what Fishtronaut, Marina, and Zeek discover on this mission that teaches not only that lying is dangerous, but also every lie will eventually be found out.

Episode 14

The Case of the Home That Became a Street

Educational Objective

Show children that caves are unique habitats, with their own balance. Present children with different species, animal or vegetable, who live in caves. Show the difference between predatory tourism x sustained tourism.

Synopsis

A mudslide opens up the bottom of a cave, changing its shape, and turning it into a tunnel that quickly becomes a passageway for all sorts of animals. This greatly affects the cave-dwellers routines as well as many other Park animals. Marina, Zeek, and Fishtronaut have their mission: Protect and restore this habitat while making sure that other mudslides don't happen.

Episode 15 The Case of the Silly Fight

Educational Objective

Encourage children to share things.

Synopsis

Its springtime and the Park is full of baby animals. Two of them, a baby elephant and a baby ostrich, find a lucky clover. The dispute over the clover begins as a silly fight, but threatens to become a much bigger deal, before spreading to the other animals and destroying the rabbit hole. Marina,

Fishtronaut, and Zeek are going to have to be very diplomatic and show that through conversation, they can reach an agreement.

Episode 18 The Case of the Unknown Animals

Educational Objective

Present children with different animals, their names and characteristics, show the biodiversity in the tree canopy.

Synopsis

Marina has to put together a photo album of the park animals for a school project. While she's working on it, a tortoise, after accidently being launched from a seesaw by a hippopotamus, goes flying trough the air and ends up on top of a walnut tree. On mission to save him, the heroes end up discovering a whole new world of species in the tree canopy.
